


### 10:30a Oliver Chin

### 11a Annie Barrows




Author of the popular series *Ivy & Bean*, Barrows began writing children's books after writing a few books for grown-ups. Her other children's book is *The*


*Magic Half*, about a girl who finds a portal to 1935 in her new home. At 11:30, Barrows will take children on a tour of Doe Library.

#### *Common Core State Standards: A New Trajectory or an Old Rut?*

Get the latest update on the Common Core from literacy expert P. David Pearson.

He will discuss the good, the bad and everything in between. While acknowledging that implementation is always a challenge, Pearson points to opportunities such as:

- a greater focus on writing and developing arguments and explanations;
- a shift to writing as a way to clarify thinking; and
- giving students more practice with complex text and academic language.

Pearson is a former Dean of Berkeley's Graduate School of Education and is co-principal investigator of Seeds of Science/Roots of Reading – a research and development effort with Lawrence Hall of Science in which reading, writing, and language are employed as tools to foster the development of knowledge and inquiry in science.

#### *Book Smart: How to Develop and Support Successful, Motivated Readers*

Learn how to raise independent readers from literacy expert Anne E. Cunningham, who is co-author of *Book Smart: How to Support Successful, Motivated Readers*.

*Book Smart* is a how-to guide rich with stories, lessons, activities, and ideas aimed at addressing the broad range of interpersonal, social, emotional, and motivational skills that must be fostered in young children.

The authors walk parents through major developmental milestones that toddlers and elementary school students experience on the path to becoming independent readers. *Book Smart* also:

- includes more than a dozen activities and strategies sections that provide multiple suggestions for simple and playful ways to build specific reading skills;
- offers guidance on how parents can foster social and emotional development; and
- serves as a resource book for parents to refer back to for several years.
