To Celebrate Women Veterans, Air Force Captain Announces First-Ever Multicultural Picture Book for Children Three to Seven Years-Old

Written by award-winning author Graciela Tiscareño-Sato and illustrated by Linda Lens, this book is now available for pre-order—‘Good Night Captain Mama’ brings home the message that mama can keep us all safe at home and abroad; just in time for Veterans Day

Hayward, CA (November 8, 2012)—During the 1990s, while circumnavigating the globe onboard KC-135 refueling tankers, Graciela Tiscareño-Sato was among the few women serving as aircrew members in the U.S. Air Force. As Veterans Day is November 11th, the timing is perfect to celebrate and recognize women veterans, mothers currently serving in the military, and all women who don a military uniform each day to keep us all safe.

It is critical to address the curiosity of young children about the military at a young age, both girls and boys. This children’s book does just that. [Good Night Captain Mama](#) is a multicultural, early picture book of approximately 850 words. The main character is a young boy in pajamas. As he passes Mama’s bedroom, he sees her in her olive-green Air Force-issued flight suit. The child is curious about the colorful patches on the uniform and asks questions. The patches’ symbolism helps aviator Mama explain what it means to serve in the U.S. Air Force. This sweet, reassuring story was inspired by a conversation between the author and her preschool-aged son.



“Children have a natural curiosity about military uniforms and insignia. My son’s questions, as he pulled the Velcro patches off my flight suit, provided the perfect opportunity to explain why I served. I wanted to share that child-inspired conversation with preschools, families (both military and non-military), to address that curiosity; the book idea was born that night,” says author Tiscareño-Sato.

Ron Nixon, owner of the Omaha, Nebraska veteran-owned bookstore RWR Innovations LLC, connected with Graciela through an Air Force veterans group on LinkedIn. Ron served in the Air Force, as did all four of his children. He endorsed the book saying, “American preschools and families need this book to show young children why people wear the uniform every day. By guiding the conversation in the book as the child explores his mother’s colorful uniform patches, the child learns and feels a sense of pride about his mother’s service. I am happy that Graciela has made this effort in this simple, creative way.”

“During a recent vacation, we traveled to Spokane, Washington where I was stationed,” continues Tiscareño-Sato. “We visited one of the units I used to fly with, the 93rd Air Refueling Squadron (ARS). A young female pilot escorted us to a hangar where a KC-135R tanker was available for my family to explore. I went first up the ladder into the cockpit as I’d done so many times before. This time however, I was able to take a picture of each of my children coming up the ladder; they were all ecstatic!”





The author is visiting Omaha, Nebraska Nov 8 – 11th to deliver a keynote at a leadership conference pertaining to her first award-winning book, *Latinnovating, Green American Jobs and the Latinos Creating Them*. Following that appearance, Tiscareño-Sato will be previewing her upcoming children's book, *Good Night Captain Mama* for the first time anywhere.
